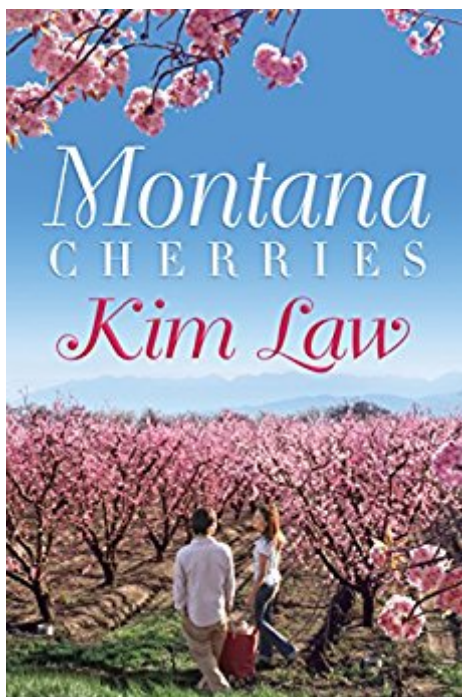

The family, from the father to the five brothers to the sister that has cared for all of them are all suffering from the effects of something they were only aware of in varying degrees. All the characters in this book are compelling, complicated and wonderfully flawed. The story is happy and wrenching and will have you experiencing every emotion possible. The romance storyline in this book is less prominent than most would anticipate but is certainly enjoyable and satisfying. The more active storyline is that of the family dynamic and the damage caused by the experiences they had.
