

I've read a lot of books about naval warfare in World War Two and this is by far the best one. The detail is impressive. The author has done his homework. As for the personal stuff, it's good and not overdone or overwrought. The people portrayed are decent, moral men and women and it was refreshing to read about them. I give this book very high marks.

I enjoyed this book. The characters are well drawn and the action is described in intense detail. The scope of the book is perhaps the only issue. It attempts to cover nearly the entire Pacific theater of WW II. Homewood's earlier books were perhaps more successful in that they focused on a smaller cast of characters and only the parts of the war that effected them. Still, I recommend this book to anyone interested in a very well written story of the war.
